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### What are OER?

Open educational resources (OER) are high-quality teaching, learning, and research resources that reside in a public domain or have been released under an intellectual property license that permits their free use and repurposing by others.

- Full courses
- Textbooks
- Course materials
- Modules
- Faculty-created content
- Streaming videos
- Tests
- Software
- And any other tools, materials, or techniques used to support access to knowledge



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### **AB 798**

College Textbook Affordability Act of 2015

#### Goal:

Reduce costs for college students by encouraging faculty to accelerate the adoption of lower cost, high-quality, open educational resources.

#### What:

- OER Adoption Incentive Program
  - Professional Development
  - OER curation activities
  - Curriculum modification
  - Tech support

#### How:

- Academic Senate
  - Pass Resolution
  - Develop a plan (in consultation w/ students and administration)
  - Submit plan to CA OER Council (June 30, 2016)
